

THE ARC MID-HUDSON LAUNCHES ABILITIES CAMPAIGN

As part of CQL (The Council on Quality and Leadership), The Arc Mid-Hudson is running an Abilities Campaign that features people we support and shows off their ability. Many people we support have expressed that they do not like to be labeled as someone with a disability, but would like to be known for their ability and what they enjoy doing. The campaign began in July and will run through

December. Marketing efforts will include the distribution of "What's Your Ability?" shirts. Each person will write their skill on their shirt, along with a short story describing their ability and who they are. In addition to posting on our website, we will also be posting on social media and YouTube.







THE ARC AWARDED \$91,000 IN GRANTS FROM NYSARC TRUST SERVICES

The Arc Mid-Hudson, a not-forprofit organization supporting people with disabilities in Greene, Putnam, and Ulster counties has been awarded \$91,000 in grants from the Trustee Management Board of The NYSARC Trust Services to support The Arc Mid-Hudson guardianship and recreation programs.

NYSARC Trust Services administers supplemental needs trusts (SNT) and pooled trusts that can make dramatic improvements to the lives of people with disabilities by enabling individuals to maintain financial eligibility for Medicaid and other meanstested government benefit programs. For 2022, NYSARC Trust Services is proud to fulfill its commitment to enhancing the lives of people with disabilities by awarding a total of \$3,189,968 to The Arc New York chapters statewide.

This year, The Arc Mid-Hudson received \$61,000 to provide guardianship services for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities who would not otherwise have a legal guardian or advocate. Supported by Chapter staff and community volunteers, The Arc Mid-Hudson Guardianship Program currently provides guardianship supports and services to 10 people, and is ready to assist 8 people as a Standby or Alternate Standby guardian.

NYSARC Trust Services also awarded The Arc Mid-Hudson \$30,000 to support new recreational opportunities and enrich the lives of the more than 1,800 individuals it serves. The Arc Mid-Hudson plans to use the recreation grant funds to allow for individuals to have opportunities and experiences that they might not be able to fund themselves.



I recently had the opportunity to vacation outside of the United States and was, again, reminded that there are many more similarities between human beings than there are differences. We may speak differently, act differently, and enjoy different things, but we all have one important thing in common, and that is a need to be loved, supported, and connected with other people. Whether it's with your family, a friend, or the person behind the cash register, we are social creatures and we have a need to feel an attachment to another person or group of people.

As we prepare for our 3rd reaccreditation with the Council on Quality and Leadership (CQL), there is one major component that I feel is the most important part of the CQL process and that is the development of Personal Outcome Measures (POM). Developing a POM is really quite simple. It's about having a conversation with someone who we support, learning about what their goals and aspirations are, and what they want from their life. We learn about what this person wants and with whom they would like to socialize. While it's a simple process for the interviewer, it requires training and a certain skillset to be able to draw out and understand what the person's needs are. When done correctly, it is such a powerful tool.

With this information in hand, we then develop a plan on how to best support the person to help them reach their goals. We make sure the right people are a part of their "circle of support" and that there are opportunities for this person to grow and reach their desired outcomes. We have been CQL certified for over 8 years and it has made such a dramatic difference in the quality of support that we provide. Understanding what a person wants is so important, and then it's up to us to create a plan and a network of support both within our organization and out in the community.

The funny thing about conducting a POM interview is that we often discover that the needs and desires of the people we are supporting are not much different than our own personal needs and goals. As I started out saying, "there are many more similarities between human beings than there are differences" — love, support, and a connection with other people. That's what it's all about, and that's what we strive to provide each and every day at The Arc Mid-Hudson.


